Our wetland ecosystems on Kaua'i are home to 5 species of endemic

birds that are endangered/threatened.

## These include:

1. Nēne (Hawaiian Goose)

2. 'Alae 'Ula (Hawaiian Gallinule/Moorhen)

3. 'Alae ke'oke'o (Hawaiian Coot)

4. Koloa Maoli (Hawaiian Duck)

5. Ae'o (Hawaiian Stilt)





**Endemic** means that these species occur nowhere else in the world!

Some invasive species that exist in our wetland ecosystems include:

1. Apple Snail

2. Bull Frog

3. Cattle Egret

4. Tilapia

5. Barn Owl

\*Note: there is a native, endemic species of owl called the Pueo (Hawaiian Short-eared Owl). Unlike most owls, the Pueo are more active during the day.



**Invasive** means that these species are not native to Hawai'i, were introduced by human assistance <u>and</u> cause harm to the environment, native species, economy, and/or human health.
